Demolition Operative Apprenticeship Level 2

What is a Demolition Operative?

This Apprenticeship covers all the basic principles you need to learn to become a Demolition Operative, carrying out the process of demolishing or part-demolishing structures ranging from standard brick and concrete buildings to bridges, industrial plant and power stations. It is a safety-critical role, utilising hand and power tools to carry out demolition work to strict operating procedures to ensure the demolition process is continuously and safely under control.

Demolition Operatives provide a supporting role in demolition projects. They are typically involved in a range of tasks as part of a team and under supervision, including using hand and power tools to remove internal parts of buildings such as doors, radiators and ceilings; using a range of heating and cutting equipment to burn through different types of metals; carrying out lifting operations working with various kinds of lifting equipment ranging from hoists to cranes; being aware of the requirement to protect the environment and recycle materials.

Apprenticeship Summary

Duration	London South East Colleges regionally coordinates this 2-year Apprenticeship.
Entry requirements	Apprentices who have not already achieved Level 1 in Maths and English must first prioritise reaching this. Once completed, the focus can shift towards advancing to Level 2.
Assessment and Training	This is a combination of classroom-based theory and practical training with site assessments. The end-point assessment includes two methods: practical testing and professional discussion.
